## **Case Study Pactera**

Presenting a cross-cultural critique of global liberalism, this book argues for a broad-based challenge that can meet it on its own scale. It probes many of the key challenges we face in the new millennium, and is a useful read for students of politics and globalization.

Now in its third edition, this is the only outsourcing and offshoring book to offer a broad but coherent guide to the strategy, operations and management of ITO and BPO outsourcing and offshoring, from how to source new relationships to managing business processes in a national and global context.

Family law in multi-religious settings poses a problem for gender equality. However there is a need to learn more about the ways gender inequality is manifested and the extent to which women are affected in their capacity for acting on their personal relationships. This thesis asks the following research question: 'How does the enactment of family law frameworks impact on the ways women negotiate their personal relationships in post-conflict Lebanon?' The thesis contests mainstream statutory and cultural explanations of the gendering effect of family law in non-western contexts for three reasons. First, they overlook the interconnectedness between legal frameworks and broader social norms within which actors operate. Second, they reduce gender equality to the level of entitlements rather than outcomes. Third, they fix women's agency as static and one-dimensional. This thesis presents a broader view of the 'enacted' aspects of family law frameworks and examines their impact as historically-bound social institutions that exercise a dynamic gendering effect. It uses qualitative research methods to examine the case of post-conflict Lebanon in the light of the renegotiation of 'consociational' citizenship in the National Reconciliation Pact era (1990-2005). Findings suggest that family law forms an order of 'gender governance' that exercises institutional gender inequality in three ways. At the judicial level, women's legal personhood is blurred in both legal texts and judicial practice. At the normative level, women's subjectivity is confined within dominant gendered norms on family relations and womanhood ideals. Finally at the level of social spaces for action, women are restricted in their individual and collective capacity for negotiating their rights. Hence, women's subjectivity is found to be composite and fluid, continuously shaping various directions for agency beyond narrow western definitions of freedom. The thesis' main contribution is to argue for the need to engage more thoroughly with family law's institutional complexity and the processes of their enactment. The concept of 'gender governance' helps explain why women have so far been unable to organise effectively towards challenging or reforming family law in multi-religious contexts. It also contextualises citizenship in multi-religious settings by framing the religious influence within political discourses on national identity and post-conflict state building.

The case studies in this volume examine the politics of military small arms disarmament. When, they ask, is surplus destruction most likely? And what can be done to make destruction more likely and more effective? Case studies examine small arms destruction by NATO and the OSCE, and in Bulgaria, Cambodia, Germany, Kazakhstan, Papua New Guinea, Romania, Serbia, Ukraine and others. Preface: At the end of the 1980s, Poland, like the other countries of Eastern Europe, underwent a rather sudden shift away from communist rule and into an uncertain new world of democracy and economic reform. The events spurred by the repudiation of Poland's last communist regime in 1989 demanded a new and updated version of Poland: A Country Study. Because the emergence of the opposition Solidarity movement in 1980 increased the flow of information from communist Poland, reliable coverage of the 1980s has been possible. Thus, this new treatment of Poland is based on a number of authoritative monographs and a host of scholarly articles. The most useful of those sources are sited in a bibliographic summary at the end of each chapter. The authors of this edition have described changes in the past ten years against the historical, political, and social background of Poland. Particular emphasis falls on the transition period that began in 1989 with the rejection of the last communist government. This period, a historic watershed not yet concluded in 1993, promises to have permanent impact on all aspects of Polish life. The authors have attempted to present a compact, accessible, and unbiased treatment of five main topics: historical setting, society and its environment, the economy, government and politics, and national security.

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
