The shift in taste from fantasy to realism after WWII meant that Nielsen did not retain his pre-war popularity. Composer Otto Lindblad set the poem to music, and the composition was published in January 1840. Its

popularity peaked in 1845, after which it was seldom sung. Andersen spent two weeks at the Augustenborg Palace in the autumn of 1844.
