Using a six-step process, this text integrates theory, research, and practice and provides advice on designing, implementing, and evaluating theory-based nutrition education.

This book gives student-teachers the chance to learn from the experiences of students who have just completed a course in preparing to teach. The book is a companion; its tone friendly, conversational, and relaxed. Even at the most testing times in a course, you can turn to *Preparing to Teach: Learning from Experience* and find voices that say 'yes, I've felt like that too'.
