

## The Wide Mouthed Frog A Pop Up Book

After asking the jungle animals what they like to do, vain Wendy the wide-mouthed frog decides that she is better than all of them and dives into the sea to see if she can find anyone more interesting, but things don't turn out as she planned.

Frog loves his log, so when a storm washes away his home, he tries everything to hang on as he drifts downstream. But when Frog has to abandon his log, he finds another ...or so it seems.
