Having made its debut in the Franco-Prussian War in 1870, anti-aircraft artillery was used extensively in the First World War. It was, however, not until the Second World War that anti-aircraft artillery truly came into prominence, shooting down more aircraft than any other weapon and seriously affecting the conduct of air operations. The development of anti-aircraft artillery continued into the Cold War, resulting in the extensive introduction of surface-to-air missiles, or SAMs. Such weapons are cheaper to manufacture, simpler to maintain, and easier to operate than the vast fleet of aircraft required to defend an airspace. During this short but bitter conflict, Egyptian and Syrian air defenses shot down nearly fifty Israeli aircraft in the first three days alone – almost a fourth of Israel's entire combat aircraft fleet. In all, Israel lost 104 aircraft during the war and, for the first time, more aircraft were lost to SAMs than any other cause. The age of surface-to-air missiles had dawned. The part that such equipment played in all of the major conflicts

Based on Luftwaffe delta-wing technology, the subsonic Avro Vulcan was years ahead of its time in terms of design, power, payload and possessed the handling characteristics of a fighter. First flying in 1951, the mighty Vulcan spearheaded the UK deterrence policy in the Cold War. This fascinating account includes trials, development, first flights and operational duties.
